


Amenity Package Updates:

- **Pool Construction:** Construction on the pool has begun. The anticipated opening date is Memorial Day, 2021, weather permitting. The first phase of this long-awaited amenity to West Highlands will contain a pools, a splash pad, restrooms, and a pavilion. Futures plans include another pool at the site in the second phase.
- **Dog Park:** Located at the corner of Drew and Sanford. Future addition of water, shade, and benches are planned. Please adhere to the rules posted at the park and on our <u>West Highlands Website</u>.
- HOA Meeting: November 14, 2020 9:00am-10:30am. We will conduct a virtual HOA meeting on November 14th. In advance of this meeting, we will send out a copy of the 2021 budget as well as the link for the meeting invite and how you can submit questions prior to the meeting. In addition, the HOA Board will provide updates from various committees and Brock Built will provide updates on West Highlands construction.



Neighborhood Reminders

- Pets: All dogs are required to be on a leash when outside of the home or outside of a fenced in yard. No pets are permitted to trespass on a neighbor's property; please respect your neighbors space and privacy. Owners are required to pick up after their pets. This includes all common areas. Pet waste stations are located at parks, Hollingsworth Blvd Greenway, and the new Dog Park. If you have suggestions on locations for additional pet waste stations, please email Sentry. See Community Rules and Dog Park Rules on website. If you see someone violating the rules, please take a photo of the owner and dog and submit to Sentry Management. Submissions to Sentry will need to include the homeowners address for us to contact them.
- Park Usage: Please remember, to conduct a party, gathering, or meeting of over 6 people in one of the common spaces requires reservations. Updated rules and regulations for the Park and Common Areas, as well as the reservation form, are posted on <u>website</u>. Please adhere to these rules to help us all share our amenities and respect our neighbors.
- ACC: Modifications to the exterior of your property must be submitted to the ACC for approval before any work begins. If work is started without prior approval, the homeowner risks being cited for a covenant violation and may be required to alter or remove the changes at significant additional cost. Please refer to the <u>website</u> to review the forms/processes.
- <u>ATL311.com</u> is a great resource for trash pick up and schedule, scheduling bulk collection, garbage bin replacement, and more. Please remember to remove your trash bins by the end of garbage day.
- **Parking:** Refer to the <u>website</u> to familiarize yourself on our Parking Policy.



Tree Maintenance

Now is the time to start preparing for the cost of pruning trees. Though you can prune your trees anytime of the year, annual pruning is ideal during late winter to early spring. However, if you have not pruned your tree(s) during last winter/spring season or two, three....never, you may need to expedite the pruning as soon as possible. The Association recommends consulting with a professional tree company since there is more to consider when pruning a tree than just cutting branches. Your tree needs immediate pruning when at least one of the following events has occurred:

- If your tree is blocking/obstructing the view of street signs (stop, street name, speed limit, parking, etc.), then the tree needs to be pruned away and above the height of the signs to allow clear sight for both motorists and pedestrians.
- If your tree limbs are hanging below a 6 foot clearance from the sidewalk or curb, then the tree needs to be trimmed from the ground up vertically to a 6 foot clearance in height. This will allow pedestrians clear and safe passage. Arborists recommend the lowest permanent branch should be 14 feet over a street and 8 feet over a sidewalk.
- If your tree limbs are encroaching onto your neighbor's property or common area property, then your tree needs to pruned back to your property line. Streets and alleyways need to remain clear from tree's spread that is obstructing vehicular access including high-profile delivery trucks (i.e., 14 feet height clearance).
- If your tree's spread/skirt is causing too much shade on the lawn and preventing the grass and/or plants to grow, then the tree's spread/skirt needs to be pruned back and pruned up higher to allow for more sun on the lawn (aka Crown Lifting).
- If your tree becomes top heavy, then the tree needs to be pruned to prevent structural damage or damage to property from fallen limbs caused by high winds or heavy rain.


If your tree is dead, dying, diseased or decaying, then you should have it removed and replaced with a new tree. IMPORTANT: Before removing any tree (whether a dying tree; or a tree replacement on a healthy existing tree), please submit a permit to have the tree removed through the City of Atlanta, Arborist Division. The application for the permit is free, however removing a tree without being issued a permit comes with a stiff penalty fee.

Please avoid "Tree Topping". It is a harmful pruning practice and destroys the natural form of a tree. This includes tree topping Crepe Myrtles. Topping stresses trees and leads to decay.

To add or replace a tree, please make sure to submit an Architectural Control Committee (ACC) request to Sentry Management atlantanorthcompliance@sentrymgt.com.
